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ABSTRACT

Texts should be prepared in Times New Roman, 12-point font, with justified alignment. Papers must be submitted in Word (.doc or .docx) format; submissions in PDF format will not be considered for evaluation. In-text citations and the reference list should be prepared in accordance with APA style guidelines. All papers must include an English abstract, which should be 130–200 words in length. All page margins should be set to 2.5 cm, and the line spacing should be 1.25. No additional spacing should be left before or after paragraphs. A blank line should be left before each main heading. Papers formatted in multiple columns will not be accepted. Figures, tables, and graphs included in the text should be numbered and appropriately referenced where necessary. The font type and font size used in tables, figures, and graphs should be adjusted to ensure that their contents are easy to read and understand. Tables, figures, and graphs should be centered on the page. Table captions should be placed above the tables, while figure and graph captions should be placed below the corresponding figures and graphs. All submitted papers will undergo plagiarism screening. If the plagiarism rate in a full paper exceeds 20%, the paper will be returned to the author. For abstracts, the paper will be rejected if plagiarism is detected even in a single sentence. Therefore, authors are strongly advised to check their papers for plagiarism before submission. Full texts must not exceed 8 pages.

Keywords : There must be at least three keywords. Papers submitted without keywords will not be considered for evaluation.
