

## **IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FOR OUR TURKISH MEDICINE PROGRAM STUDENTS!**

According to Article 8, paragraph 1 of Gazi University's Associate and Undergraduate Education and Examination Regulation, **students who do not renew their registration within the period specified in the academic calendar cannot attend classes or exams for that semester/year**. According to paragraph 5, students must obtain course registration approval from their advisor.

In accordance with the provisions of the regulation, all students must complete their course registrations and approvals for the **Fall Semester of the 2024-2025** academic year between **September 12-16, 2024**.

(Students who exceed the normal study period (6 years) and foreign students without scholarships will be able to complete their course registration and approval processes online after paying their tuition fees.) **Since advisor approval cannot be granted without student approval, first-year students attending their classes for the first time this semester must enroll in:**

- **1st Year: TIP-100, TAR-101 (History), TUR-101 (Turkish Language), ENG-101 (English), and one elective course from the 1st-year elective list.**
- **2nd Year: TIP-200, ENG-201 (English, if not exempt), and one elective course from the 2nd-year elective list.**
- **3rd Year: TIP-300, ENG-301 (English, if not exempt), and one elective course from the 3rd-year elective list.**
- **4th Year: 11 internships and ENG-401 (English).**
- **5th Year: All internship courses.**
- **6th Year: All internship courses.**

Additionally, irregular 4th, 5th, and 6th-year students should only select the courses for which they are responsible and complete the first stage of registration. Afterward, they must proceed to the second stage of student course registration approval. Advisors will complete the advisor approval process for students who have finished the student approval.

**If students do not complete this two-step approval process, they will lose their student rights and will not be able to take exams, potentially leading to delays in their academic progress.**
