

Dear Candidates,

The Erasmus Foreign Language Exam will be held on Tuesday, **March 3, 2026**, in the classrooms of the School of Foreign Languages at Gölbaşı Campus, Gazi University.

- The first session will begin at 09:30 and will cover the Reading, Listening, and Writing sections.
- The second session will begin at 13:30 and will consist of the Speaking section.
- All parts of the exam will be administered face to face.

Candidates who wish to take the exam must complete the application form by **Wednesday, February 25, 2026, at 12:00**. **The system will close at 12:01. No applications will be accepted after the system is closed.**

Reading Section

The reading section consists of **55 multiple-choice questions**, including:

- 3 cloze tests (each with 5 multiple-choice questions)
- 10 paragraph completion questions (*mark the choice that best completes each paragraph*)
- 5 sentence completion questions (*mark the choice that best completes each sentence*)
- 4 reading comprehension texts with a total of 20 questions (*answer the following questions based on the texts*).
- 5 questions asking you to find the irrelevant sentence (identify the sentence that disrupts the meaning of the paragraph).

Listening Section

The listening section includes **25 multiple-choice questions** divided into **5 parts**, each containing 5 questions. The recordings will include **short dialogues, conversations or talks, and lectures**.

There are a total of **80 questions** in the Reading and Listening sections. Each question is worth **1.25 points**. The total score (out of 100) will be divided by two and calculated **out of 50 points**. This score will then be combined with the Writing and Speaking section scores.

Writing Section

In this section, candidates are required to write **a paragraph of 150–200 words** on a given topic. This section is worth **25 points**.

Speaking Section

The speaking section will be conducted in an interview format — one instructor and one student — through question and answer interaction. This section is also worth **25 points**.

To pass the exam, candidates must achieve **a minimum total score of 50 points**.
